Introduction

The City of Waseca, MN owns and operates a municipal electric utility providing service to approximately 4.200 retail electric customers. The electric utility operates under the direction of the Waseca City Council (Waseca). This report has been prepared by Dave Berg Consulting, LLC to examine the rates and charges for electric service in Waseca. The study includes an examination of the allocated cost of service based on an actual 2023 'Test Year.' It also includes projected operating results for 2024-2027 (Study Period). As a result of the analyses undertaken and reported on herein, certain conclusions and recommendations have been made.



Section 2 Projected Operating Results Existing Rates

The rates charged for electric services by Waseca, combined with other operating and non-operating revenues, must be sufficient to meet the cost of providing services to Waseca's retail customers. This is necessary to ensure the long-term financial health of Waseca. The cost of providing services consists of normal operating expenses such as wholesale power purchases, local distribution, customer and administrative functions, capital improvements, contributions to the City of Waseca and other non-operating expenses.

An analysis of the operating results for Waseca during the 2023-2027 Study Period has been performed assuming the current retail rates and charges remain in effect through the Study Period. This analysis has been done to determine the overall need, if any, for additional revenue through rates to meet projected revenue requirements. The analyses and assumptions utilized in these projections are explained below.

Estimated Revenues - Existing Rates

Retail Sales

Waseca sells retail power and energy to residential, commercial general service and mid and large commercial customers. No overall growth in sales has been assumed during the Study Period.

Waseca offsets certain wholesale costs through its Energy Cost Adjustment (ECA) which is based on monthly wholesale adjustments from the Southern Minnesota Municipal Power Agency (SMMPA). During 2023, Waseca did not add any ECA adjustments to retail customer bills. This is assumed to continue during the Study Period.



Exhibit 2-A is a summarized listing of Waseca's historical and projected electric operating results at existing retail rates. The historical and projected revenues from retail sales of power and energy to different groups of customers are included in Charges for Services under Operating Revenues. Operating Revenues also include other miscellaneous operating revenues.

Revenue Requirements

Purchased Power

Waseca purchases all of its wholesale power and energy requirements from SMMPA under the terms of a long-term wholesale power contract. Purchased power is the largest single operating expense for Waseca. In 2023, purchased power accounted for approximately 71% of Waseca's total operating expenses.

It has been assumed that SMMPA will not increase its current wholesale rates during the Study Period. SMMPA does include a monthly energy cost adjustment (ECA) as part of its wholesale rate structure. For purposes of the wholesale cost projections, it is assumed that the SMMPA ECA will be zero each year.

Other Operating Expenses

Waseca incurs other operating expenses associated with local electric system operations. Distribution operating and maintenance expenses are related to the substations, overhead and underground lines and customer facilities located in Waseca. Administrative and other expenses are required for reading meters, sending and processing bills, dealing with customer inquiries, covering utility management, employee benefits, training and other administrative costs. Waseca also participates in SMMPA demand side management programs designed to reduce customer's use of electric energy. These types of programs are mandated by the state of Minnesota.

Depreciation

Waseca has annual depreciation costs based on its system investments. Depreciation during the Study Period is based on budgeted Waseca amounts and future capital improvements. Depreciation is a funded non-cash expense that generates monies available for annual capital improvements and reserves.

Non-operating Revenue (Expenses)

Waseca's non-operating revenue is primarily associated with investment income. Non-operating expenses include interest expenses.

City Support

Waseca makes a direct cash transfer to the City of Waseca. Effective in 2024, this transfer has increased from \$437,000 to \$600,000 and has assumed to remain steady at \$600,000 through the Study Period.

Capital Improvements

Waseca makes annual normal capital investments in its electric system. Annual electric capital improvements for the Study Period, as budgeted by Waseca, are shown in Table 2-1 below.

Projected Operating Results – Existing Rates

Based on the assumptions outlined above, the resulting projected operating results assuming continued application of the existing retail rates are summarized in Table 2-2

for the electric utility. A summary presentation of the operating results is shown in Exhibit 2-A.

Cash Reserves

A summary of the impact of the projected operating results on Waseca's cash reserves for the Study Period is shown at the end of Exhibit 2-A and in Table 2-3 below.

As shown below, under existing retail rates and estimated revenue requirements over the Study Period, the cash reserves for the electric utility are projected to remain relatively stable at approximately \$4.6 million or 60% of operating revenue.

Cost-of-Service

A cost-of-service analysis was performed to determine the allocated cost to serve each of Waseca's customer classes within the electric utility. Customer classes exist, in part, because the cost to serve different kinds of customers varies. The cost-of-service analysis has been performed on a 2023 'Test Year' based on actual unaudited 2023 financials, operations and sales. The results of the cost-of-service study give an indication of the degree of revenue recovery warranted for each class of customers. A comparison of the allocated cost to serve a class of customers and the actual revenues received from that class is taken into consideration during rate design.

Functionalization of Costs

Waseca's Test Year electric revenue requirements have been divided into four functional categories. These categories are described below.

Power Supply – the production function is related to the cost of purchases from SMMPA for generation and transmission.

Distribution – distribution expenses are related to the Waseca system for delivering power and energy to Waseca customers. They include substation and distribution system costs.

Customer – these costs are fixed costs associated with the service facilities utilized to deliver electric power and energy directly to customers. They also include items such as meter reading, billing, collections and dealing with customers by customer service representatives.

Revenue – revenue related costs include certain non-operating revenues, transfers and utility margin.



Table 3-1 below summarizes the functional electric costs for the 2023 Test Year. The detailed cost functions are shown in Exhibit 3-A.

Classification of Costs

Within each function, the revenue requirements have been divided into distinct cost classifications. These cost classifications are described below.

Demand Related – demand related costs are fixed costs that do not vary with hourly consumption. Demand related costs are required to meet the overall demand of the system as expressed in kW.

Energy Related – energy related costs vary based on hourly consumption in kWh.

Customer Related – costs related to serving, metering and billing of individual customers.

Revenue Related – revenue related costs vary by the amount of revenue received by the utility.

Exhibits 3-B through 3-D show the detailed classification of revenue requirements within the power supply, distribution and customer functions.

Allocation of Costs

Based on an analysis of customer class service characteristics, the classified costs summarized above were allocated to the major Waseca customer classes. Allocation of costs was performed on a fully-distributed, embedded cost allocation basis. Specific allocation factors were utilized in each of the cost classification categories as described below. Exhibit 3-E contains a summary of the development of the various allocation factors.

Demand Allocations

Customer class demands on a system can be reflected in various ways. Two primary demand allocation types were utilized in this analysis. A common industry allocator known as Coincident Peak Demand (CP) allocator is utilized to allocate demand related costs based on each class' contribution to the system peak demand each month. A 12 CP demand allocator was utilized for production demand costs. A 12 CP allocator estimates each class' demand contribution in each of the 12 months of the year. A 1 CP demand allocator was utilized for transmission demand costs. A 1 CP allocator estimates each class' demand contribution to the single annual peak demand. A Non-coincident Peak Demand (NCP) reflects a class maximum demand regardless of when it occurs. A 1 NCP method, an estimate of each class' maximum annual demand on the local system, was utilized for allocating local system demand related costs. Each class' annual NCP may occur at different times during the year.

Energy Allocations

Each class' share of energy requirements was used to allocate energy related costs. Power supply energy related expenses were allocated based on each customer class' share of total energy requirements.

Customer Allocations

Two separate customer allocators were utilized. The customer facilities (CF) allocator was used to allocate costs associated with the physical facilities required to serve individual customers. The customer service (CS) allocator is for allocation of costs associated with customer service – meter reading, billing, collections and customer inquiries. For both the customer facilities and customer service allocators, a weighted customer allocation factor is developed. Weighting factors are developed to represent the difference in service configurations between customer classifications. For instance, a larger customer facility is required for a single large power customer than for a single residential customer, or a single large power customer requires more customer service than a single residential customer.

Revenue Allocations

Revenue related costs were allocated based on each class' share of total demand, energy, customer distribution, customer service and direct costs.

Cost of Service Results

Based on the classifications and allocations described above, the estimated cost to serve each major class of customers for the 2023 Test Year was determined. Exhibit 3-F presents this analysis in detail. Table 3-2 below summarizes the total allocated electric costs for each class compared to the total electric revenues received from the class during 2023.

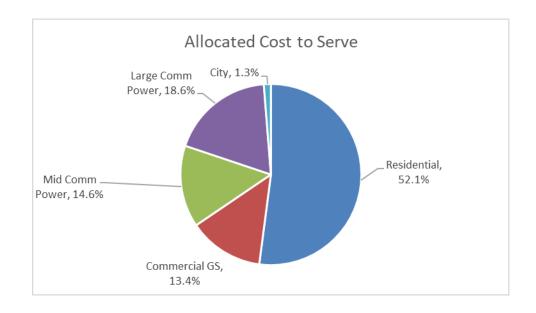

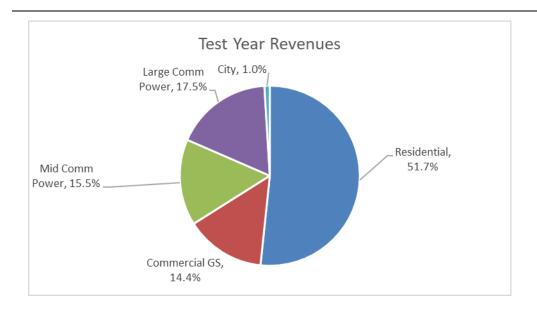

The revenue requirements and revenues as allocated to each class and summarized above are shown on a total dollars basis. Table 3-3 below makes the comparison based on percentages of total cost to serve and total revenues. The charts following Table 3-3 show a graphical comparison between allocated cost to serve and revenues as a percentage of the totals. The percentage increase/(decrease) in each class' revenue shown below is the adjustment necessary to produce revenues from each class in accordance with the allocated cost to serve. The percentage adjustments do not represent the recommended change in each class' rates. The cost-of-service results are one item for consideration in rate design. It is important to note also that the adjustments shown in the table below would not change the total revenue received by the utility and are not indicative of overall revenue needs of the utility going forward. Recommendations regarding rate design are included in Section 4 of this report.

As indicated above, Waseca's existing class revenues do not exactly match the allocated cost to serve each class. Cost based rates are one of several goals in establishing rates. The relationship between allocated costs and revenues for each class should be considered, in addition to other rate-related goals, in developing recommended rates. Cost-of-service analysis is not an exact science. There are varying assumptions that can be utilized in the analysis that will impact the final conclusions. How and when to adjust rates based on cost-of-service results is ultimately a policy decision. For instance, the subsidy to the City loads is a policy decision to utilize rate levels as one way to support City functions. The results shown above are within a reasonable margin of error. Cost-of-service is an important tool, but achieving rates that are 'exactly' cost-based would require constant evaluation and resetting of rates and would be entirely dependent on the assumptions utilized in the analysis.

Section 4 Recommendations

Changes to rates are generally based on the overall need for revenues and results of the cost-of-service analyses. The projected operating results at existing rates as presented in Section 2 of this report outline the overall revenue needs of the electric utility. Section 3 summarizes the cost-of-service results. Based on the analysis performed, certain recommendations have been listed below.

Recommendations

Our conclusions and recommendations regarding Waseca's retail electric rates are:

- Based on the analyses performed, no changes to Waseca's retail electric rates are recommended at this time.
- Current projections show reserve funds maintaining their current level through the Study Period.
- The only class receiving a significant subsidy based on the cost-of-service results is the City accounts. This is another form of City support from the electric utility. This support currently equals approximately \$22,000 per year.
- Total support to the City is approximately \$622,000 per year (cash transfer plus City rate subsidy). This amount equals 8% of operating revenues, which is a reasonable level of support from the electric utility.
- It is noted that municipal electric customers contribute approximately 8% of their electric bills to support overall City functions, but no franchise fee is currently collected from Xcel Energy and the customers it serves within the Waseca city limits.
- The current retail ECA policy is reasonable and protects the electric utility from high wholesale costs due to high wholesale ECA charges.



- If SMMPA needs to raise its published wholesale rates during the Study Period,
 Waseca may need to also adjust retail rates to cover the extra costs.
- The current structure of retail rates is reasonable (customer, energy and demand charges).
- The seasonal retail energy rates mirror the seasonal wholesale rates from SMMPA.
- The reduction of street light rates from \$3.10/customer/month to \$1.90/customer/month was warranted based on actual street light costs.
- The increase of the capital fund charge from \$4/customer/month to \$5/customer/month was reasonable based on projected capital needs.
- The current level of the capital funding charge plus non-cash depreciation expense is sufficient to cover anticipated capital improvements through the Study Period.
- Large capital improvements in the future (e.g. a new substation) should be considered for debt financing rather than cash financing.

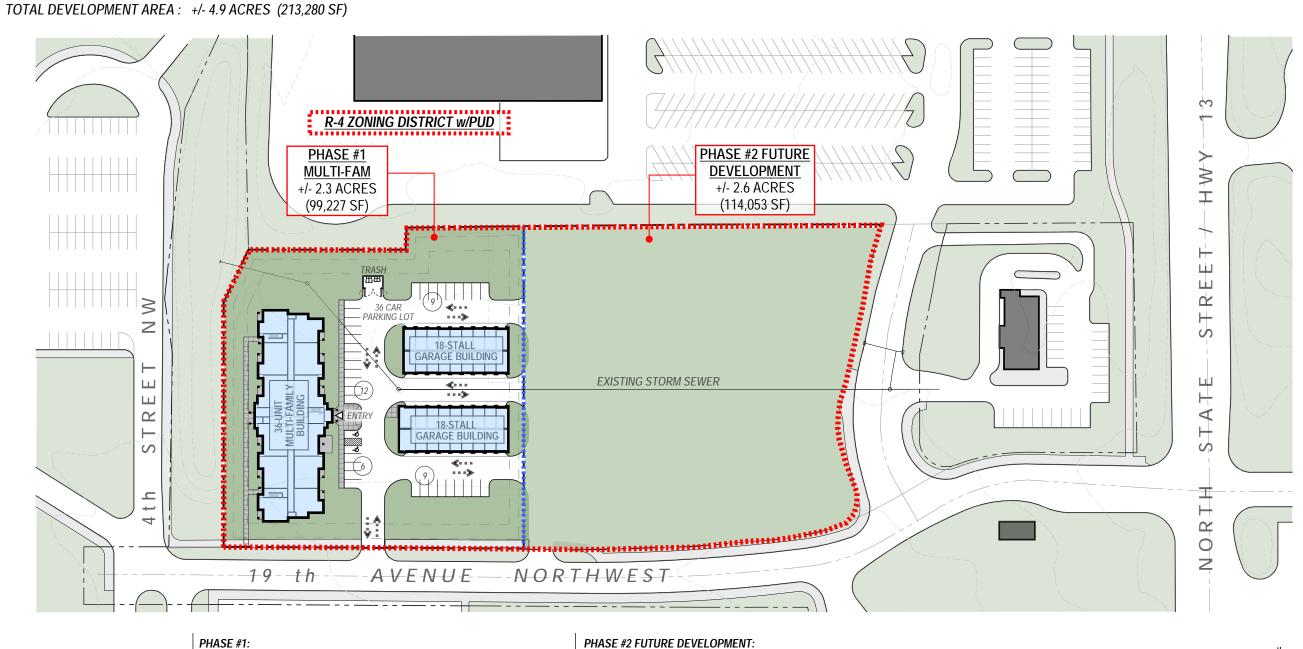

BACKGROUND: Food Trucks have been becoming increasingly popular all over the State of Minnesota. They could be allowed in Waseca through a revision of Chapter 120, which will allow the City Council to adopt an annual fee to attract more food trucks and bring more options to residents and businesses.

This ordinance also allows food trucks, vending wagons, food stands, and food carts- herein referred to as food trucks- in many public locations throughout the city. Currently, they can only park in private parking lots with no permit needed.

This revision will allow Food Trucks to enter public parking lots with a permit. Food trucks will not be allowed to park along City streets or in City parks. Special exceptions may be allowed with a Special Event Permit submitted to and approved by the City of Waseca or with a park reservation.

Due to safety concerns, the proposed language will not allow Food Trucks to park on Elm Avenue (Old Highway 14) or State Street (Highway 13) at any time.

All inspections of the food truck are required ahead of time for each vehicle. However, the city does not perform these duties; this is the responsibility of the State and County.

All vendors are expected to provide their own electricity for operations unless prior approval is completed with the City of Waseca. Electricity is only available in limited areas.

BUDGET IMPACT: This Ordinance will cost less than \$100 to publish. The permit fee to residents is proposed at \$50 per permit for one year from the date of application or \$25 for a single day/event.

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends the Waseca City Council approve Ordinance 1111.

ORDINANCE NO. 1111

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF WASECA REGULATING MOBILE FOOD VENDING TO INCLUDE FOOD TRUCKS, VENDING WAGONS, FOOD STANDS & FOOD CARTS

The City of Waseca does hereby ordain:

The Revision of Chapter 120: Mobile Food Vending of the Waseca City Code of Ordinances:

120.01 DEFINITIONS:

FARMERS' MARKET – an association of three or more persons who assemble at a defined location that is open to the public for the purposes of selling directly to the consumer the products of a farm or garden occupied and cultivated by the person selling the product. These products would include products that meet the cottage food exemptions under state law.

FOOD CART – A food and beverage service establishment propelled by the operator, a non-motorized vehicle.

MOBILE FOOD TRUCK – Every motor vehicle in which foods of any kind are carried for the purposes of selling at retail sale on City streets or other public rights-of-way.

MOBILE FOOD VENDING VEHICLE – A food and beverage service establishment that is a vehicle-mounted unit, either: 1) motorized or trailered, operating no more than twenty-one (21) days annually at any one place, or operating more than twenty-one (21) days annually at any one site with the approval of the regulatory authority as defined in Minnesota Rules, Part 4626.0020, subpart 70; or 2) operated in conjunction with a permanent business licensed under Minnesota Statutes at the site of the permanent business by the same individual or company and readily movable, without disassembling, for transport to another location.

MOBILE FOOD VENDING – A food and beverage service establishment that is a vehicle-mounted or any stationary unit but not permanently located.

OPERATOR – Any person, firm, or corporation who owns, leases, contracts, or in any other fashion permits a person to operate upon the City streets or other public rights-of-way any food vending vehicle for the purpose of vending, or the person driving or operating any such vehicle.

PRE-PACKAGED FOOD TRUCK – A vehicle offering prepared and pre-packaged food, such as ice cream products.

SEASONAL/TEMPORARY FOOD STAND – A food and beverage service establishment that is a food stand that is disassembled and moved from location to location but operates no more than twenty-one (21) days annually at any one location. A seasonal/temporary food stand may operate for more than 21 days annually at any one place with the approval of the regulatory authority, as defined in Minnesota Rules, part 4626.0020, subpart 70, that has jurisdiction over the seasonal/temporary food stand. This shall not include mobile food vending vehicles.

SPECIAL EVENT FOOD STAND – A food and beverage service establishment that is used in conjunction with celebrations and special events and which operates no more than three times annually for no more than ten (10) total days.

VENDING WAGONS— Offering food for sale from a motor vehicle on the city streets or other public rights-of-way.

120.02 PERMIT REQUIRED:

No person, business, or other entity may operate a mobile food truck or mobile food vending vehicle on any property owned or controlled by the City of Waseca, including City streets, paths and sidewalks, City lots, or City parks, without following the provisions of this ordinance.

The fee for an annual permit shall be in an amount as duly established by the City Council, which is reviewed from time to time and shall entitle the operator to vend from one such vehicle for the period of one year from the date of permit purchase. For each additional vehicle utilized by an operator, an additional permit fee shall be paid.

The applicant must submit a written application on a form prescribed by the city and include the following with its application:

- a) A copy of its current Retail Mobile Food Handler license issued by the MN Department of Health. A decal must be displayed on the vehicle as required by the MN Department of Health.
- b) Insurance or certificate for insurance coverage as required under Section 120.04.

An applicant will not be allowed to park along City streets or in City parks. Special exceptions may be allowed with a Special Event Permit submitted to and approved by the City of Waseca.

The applicant will not be allowed to park along Elm Avenue or State Street (Highway 13) at any time.

The applicant may enter private areas and lots with prior approval from that specific landowner.

The applicant may enter public parking lots with a current city-issued permit.

The applicant may enter a City Park with a paid park reservation for that day or as part of an approved Special Event application and must remain on a paved lot.

Upon approval of the application by the City, a permit for each vehicle permitted will be issued, which must be displayed by the operator in the corresponding vehicle.

120.03 FEES:

The fee shall be in an amount as established by the City Council from time to time.

An annual fee shall be charged for the operation of a vehicle year-round.

120.04 INSURANCE:

A permit will not be issued until the applicant has filed with the City evidence of insurance insuring the applicant against liability imposed by law arising out of the ownership, maintenance, or operation of such private business in amounts of at least \$500,000 for the injury or death of one person, \$1,500,000 for the injury or death of two or more persons, and \$10,000 for property damage. The City shall be named as an additional insured in the policy providing such insurance. Such policy shall further provide that it may not be canceled except upon ten (10) days written notice filed with the City. The certificate shall contain an acknowledgment signed by the insurer that prior to modification, cancellation, or termination of the subject policy, written notice shall first be sent to the City by said insurance company.

If applicable, the applicant shall also provide evidence of workers' compensation insurance coverage to the City. A permit is effective only if the required insurance coverage is constantly maintained and evidence of its continuance is on file with the City.

120.05 EQUIPMENT REQUIRED FOR MOBILE FOOD VENDING VEHICLE:

In addition to other equipment required by law, every such vehicle shall be equipped with:

- 1. A convex mirror mounted on the front so the operator can see the area in front of the vehicle obscured by the hood.
- 2. An audible alarm that is activated when the vehicle is in motion backward.
- 3. Proper signage placement in accordance with the City Zoning Ordinance.
- 4. Waste receptacles must be placed within 30 feet of the vehicle during hours of operation.
- 5. All operational trash must be removed from the site and not placed in city receptacles.
- 6. Generators must be self-contained and screened from view, operating at no more than 70 decibels.
- 7. The City will provide no water or electricity without an approved Special Event Permit application and paid electrical usage fee.
 - a. electricity usage without prior approval may be prosecuted as theft in accordance with Minnesota Statute §609.52 and possibly lead to revocation of food truck permit for the remainder of the year or indefinitely.

120.06 RESTRICTIONS ON VENDING ACTIVITY:

- 1. An operator shall vend only when the food vending vehicle is lawfully stopped.
- 2. An operator shall vend only from the side of the vehicle away from moving traffic and as near as possible to the curb or side of the street.
- 3. An operator shall not vend to any person standing in the roadway; the vehicle must face away from the roadway.
- 4. An operator shall park a minimum of 30 feet from the nearest intersecting curb line.
- 5. No vending activity shall occur between 11:00 PM and 7:00 AM on any given day. Special exceptions may be allowed with a Special Event Permit submitted to and approved by the City of Waseca.

120.07 PARKING:

Parking in city lots is permitted when complying with all ordinances, regulations, parking zones, and signage.

Parking in city streets and parks may be allowed with a Special Event Permit submitted to and approved by the City of Waseca. Sales by the permitted operator shall be made on paved lots or streets only and on the curbside only. The vehicle shall be parked within one (1) foot of the curb and a minimum of 30

feet from the nearest intersecting curb line and in compliance with all ordinances, regulations, parking zones, and posted signage.

An operator is prohibited from reserving any parking space by blocking, barricading, hooding, signing, or, in any other manner, preventing another vehicle from occupying the space.

Food vending vehicles on private property are regulated by the Waseca Zoning Ordinance. If the food vending vehicle is located on private property, a written consent or phone message from the property owner must be available upon request by the City.

120.08 OPERATING VEHICLES IN REVERSE:

The operator of a food vending vehicle shall not travel in reverse to make or attempt to make a sale.

120.09 STORAGE OF VEHICLE WHEN NOT IN USE:

When not in use, the food vending vehicle must be stored in compliance with the regulations of the City Zoning Ordinance.

120.10: SIGHT VISIBILITY AND SAFETY:

For the safety of the general public, the Waseca Police Department/City Staff reserves the right to require the immediate relocation of food vending vehicles if their placement substantially restricts the visibility of motorists, bicyclists, or pedestrians or in any other way impacts roadway conditions in an unsafe manner.

<u>120.11 EXCEPTIONS:</u> The provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to individuals or businesses operating food delivery services where they deliver food directly to the location of the consumer or who are selling at a farmers' market.

120.12 PENALTY:

Any operator violating any provision of this ordinance shall face a misdemeanor offense and possible revocation of their permit.

120.13 SEVERABILITY AND SAVINGS CLAUSE:

If any section or portion of this ordinance shall be found unconstitutional or otherwise invalid or unenforceable by a court of competent jurisdiction, those findings shall not invalidate or affect the validity and enforceability of any other section or provision of this ordinance.

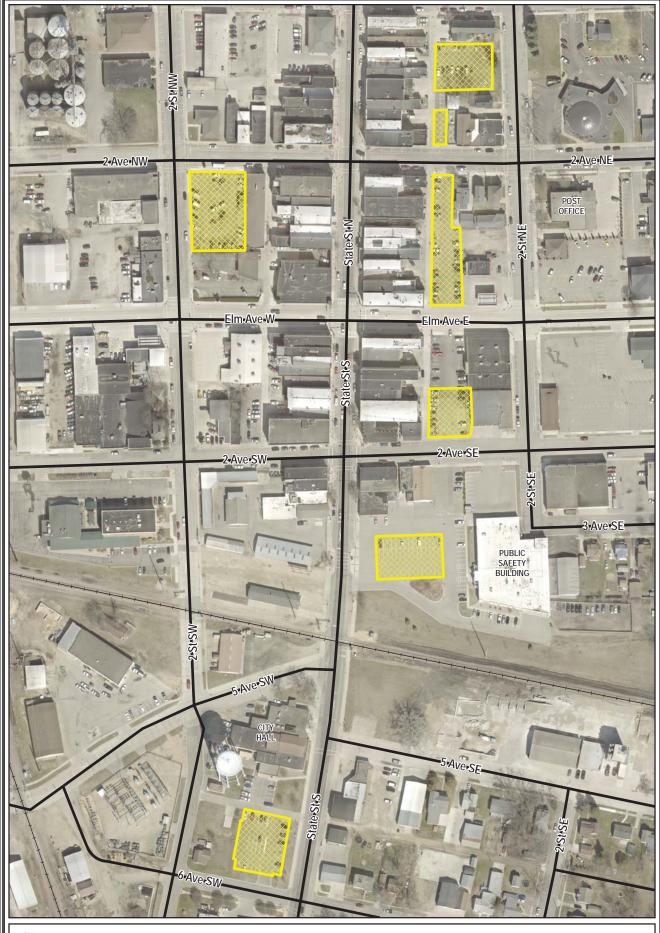

BACKGROUND: New FEMA floodplain maps have been issued and will become effective March 27, 2024. Therefore, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (MnDNR) has notified City staff that the City's zoning ordinance regarding floodplain management must be revised in order to comply with the new maps and State/Federal requirements.

The revisions contained in Ordinance No. 1113 are based on model MnDNR ordinance language, recommended edits by WSB (the City's planning and zoning consultant), and review by the Planning Commission. Please see the attached Planning Commission Memo for further details on the review process.

At their meeting on February 14, 2024, the Planning Commission held a public hearing and voted 4 to 0, recommending the adoption of Ordinance No. 1113 with paragraph (B) added to Section § 154.039 to provide clarification regarding standards for modifications and alterations of nonconforming structures.

In order to comply with State and Federal requirements, these ordinance revisions must be adopted and effective before March 27, 2024.

BUDGET IMPACT: Minimal costs associated with amending the City Code.

RECOMMENDATION: Staff recommends that the City Council conduct a Public Hearing and adopt Ordinance No. 1113, amending the floodplain management sections of Chapter 154.

ORDINANCE NO. 1113

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 154: ZONING

WHEREAS, Chapter 154 of the Waseca Code of Ordinances provides zoning provisions;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City of Waseca does hereby ordain that the amendments to Chapter 154 of the Waseca Code of Ordinances as shown herein are hereby approved and modified. The modification only amends the specified codes, the remainder of the Ordinance shall remain as previously adopted.

SECTION 1. Chapter 154: DEFINITIONS (Section § 154.202) of the Waseca Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows, underlined text is being added and strikeout text is being deleted:

BASE FLOOD. The flood having a one-percent chance of being equaled or exceeded in any given year. "Base flood" is synonymous with the term "regional flood" used in Minnesota Rules, part 6120.5000.

BASE FLOOD ELEVATION (BFE). The elevation of the base flood, regional flood, or one percent (1%) annual chance flood. The term "base flood elevation" is used in the Flood Insurance Study.

DEVELOPMENT. Any man-made change to real estate, including but not limited to construction or reconstruction of buildings, installing manufactured homes or travel trailers, installing utilities, construction of roads or bridges, erection of levees, walls, or fences, drilling, mining, filling, dredging, and storage of materials. Any man-made change to improved or unimproved real estate including, but not limited to, buildings or other structures, mining, dredging, filling, grading, paving, excavation or drilling operations, or storage of materials or equipment.

FARM FENCE. An open type of fence consisting of posts and horizontally run wire, further specified in Minnesota Statutes, section 344.02 Subd. 1(a - d).

FLOOD FRINGE. That portion of the flood plain outside of the floodway. FLOOD FRINGE is synonymous with the term "floodway fringe" used in the Flood Insurance Study for the City of Waseca. The portion of the one percent (1%) annual chance floodplain located outside of the floodway.

FLOOD INSURANCE RATE MAP (FIRM). An official map of a community, on which the Federal Insurance Administrator has delineated both the special hazard areas and the risk premium zones applicable to that community. A FIRM that has been made available digitally is called a Digital Flood Insurance Rate Map (DFIRM).

FLOOD PLAIN or FLOOD PRONE AREA. Any land area susceptible to being inundated by water from any source (see FLOOD). The beds, channels, and other areas adjoining a wetland, lake, watercourse, or other source which have been, or hereafter may be, inundated by the base flood.

FLOOD, REGIONAL. A flood which is representative of large floods known to have occurred generally in Minnesota and reasonably characteristic of what can be expected to occur on an average frequency in the magnitude of the 100 year recurrence interval. REGIONAL FLOOD is synonymous with the term "base flood" used in the Flood Insurance Study.

FLOODWAY. The bed of wetland or lake and the channel of a watercourse and those portions of the adjoining flood plain which are reasonably required to carry or store the regional flood discharge. The bed of a wetland or lake and the channel of a watercourse and those portions of the adjoining flood plain which must be reserved to carry or store the base flood discharge without cumulatively increasing the water surface elevation more than one-half (0.5) foot.

MANUFACTURED (MOBILE) HOME. A structure transportable in one or more sections which in the traveling mode is eight body feet or more in width or 40 body feet or more in length, or, when erected on site, is 320 or more square feet and which is built on a permanent chassis and designed to be used as a dwelling with or without a permanent foundation when connected to the required utilities, and includes the plumbing, heating, air conditioning, and electrical systems contained in it, and which complies with the Manufactured Home Building Code. A structure, transportable in one or more sections, which is built on a permanent chassis and is designed for use with or without a permanent foundation when attached to the required utilities, and includes the plumbing, heating, air conditioning, and electrical systems contained in it, and which complies with Manufactured Home Building Code. The term "manufactured home" does not include the term "recreational vehicle."

RECREATIONAL VEHICLE. A vehicle that is built on a single chassis, is four hundred (400) square feet or less when measured at the largest horizontal projection, is designed to be self-propelled or permanently towable by a light duty truck and is not designed primarily for use as a permanent dwelling but as temporary living quarters for recreational, camping, travel, or seasonal use. Those vehicles not meeting this definition shall be considered a structure for the purposes of this ordinance. For the purposes of this ordinance, the term recreational vehicle is synonymous with the term "travel trailer/travel vehicle."

RECREATIONAL CAMPING VEHICLE. As defined in M.S. § 327.14, Subd. 7, (a) any vehicular, portable structure built on a chassis, designed to be used as a temporary dwelling for travel, recreational, and vacation uses; (b) any structure designed to be mounted on a truck chassis for use as a temporary dwelling for travel, recreation, and vacation; (c) any portable, temporary dwelling to be used for travel, recreation, and vacation, constructed as an integral part of a self-propelled vehicle; and (d) any folding structure, mounted on wheels and designed for travel, recreation, and vacation use. See also "Motor Home".

REGULATORY FLOOD PROTECTION ELEVATION (RFPE).—The regulatory flood protection elevation shall be an elevation no lower than one foot above the elevation of the regional flood plus any increases in flood elevation caused by encroachments on the flood plain that result from designation of a floodway. An elevation no lower than one (1) foot above the elevation of the base flood plus any increases in water surface elevation caused by encroachments on the floodplain that result from designation of a floodway. These increases in water surface elevations are typically identified in the Floodway Data Tables found in the Flood Insurance Study.

STRUCTURE (Non-Floodplain Districts). Anything constructed, installed, or portable, the use of which requires a location on a parcel of land. This includes a fixed or movable building which can be used for residential, business, commercial, or office purposes, either temporarily or permanently. STRUCTURE also includes, but is not limited to, swimming pools, tennis courts, signs, sheds, docks, and similar accessory construction. The term includes recreational vehicles and travel trailers on site for more than 180 days. For floodplain management purposes, a walled and roofed building, including gas or liquid storage tanks, which are principally above ground.

STRUCTURE (Floodplain District Only). The term includes a roofed building, including a gas or liquid storage tank, that is principally above ground, as well as a manufactured home. Recreational vehicles not considered travel ready, as detailed in Section 154.037 (E), shall also be considered a nonconforming structure for the purposes of this ordinance.

SUBSTANTIAL DAMAGE. Damage of any origin sustained by a structure where the cost of restoring the structure to its before damaged condition would equal or exceed fifty percent (50%) of the market value of the structure before the damage occurred.

SUBSTANTIAL IMPROVEMENT.

- (1) Any repair, reconstruction or improvement of a structure, the cost of which equals or exceeds 50% of the market value of the structure either:
 - (a) Before the improvement or repair is started; or
- (b) If the structure has been damaged, and is being restored, before the damage occurred.
- (2) For the purposes of this definition, SUBSTANTIAL IMPROVEMENT is considered to occur when the first alteration of any wall, ceiling, floor, or other structural part of the building commences, whether or not that alteration affects the external dimensions of the structure regardless of the actual work performed. The term does not, however, include either:
- (a) Any project for improvement of a structure to comply with existing state or local health, sanitary, or safety code specifications which are solely necessary to assure safe living conditions; or
- (b) Any alteration of a historic structure provided that the alteration will not preclude the structure's continued designation as a historic structure.
- Any reconstruction, rehabilitation, addition, or other improvement of a structure, the cost of which equals or exceeds fifty percent (50%) of the market value of the structure before the "start of construction" of the improvement. This term includes structures that have incurred "substantial damage" regardless of the actual repair work performed. The term does not, however, include the following:
- (1) Any project for improvement of a structure to correct existing violations of state or local health, sanitary, or safety code specifications which have been identified by the local building official or code enforcement staff and which are the minimum necessary to assure safe living conditions.
- (2) Any alteration of a "historic structure" provided that the alteration will not preclude the structure's continued designation as a "historic structure." For the purposes of this ordinance, "historic structure" is defined in 44 CFR § 59.1.

VEHICLE, RECREATIONAL.

- (1) A vehicle that is used primarily for recreational or vacation purposes, and which is licensed and operable for use on public roadways, whether self-propelled, carried on, or towed behind a self-propelled vehicle.
- (2) Operable recreational equipment that is not licensed for used on the public roadway, but used off road, such as all terrain vehicles, boats, off road motorcycles, race vehicles, snowmobiles, or similar equipment. Such equipment shall be properly licensed if the State of Minnesota provides for such licensing.
- (3) Licensed, operable trailers which may be used to tow recreational equipment, whether such trailers are loaded or unloaded, including utility trailers. Where a trailer is loaded with recreational equipment, such trailer and equipment shall be considered to be one piece of equipment for the purposes of this section.

SECTION 2. Chapter 154: FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT OVERLAY DISTRICT of the Waseca Code of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows; Section § 154.034 through Section § 154.044 are deleted and replaced with the **text** below (Section § 154.034 through Section § 154.046):

§ 154.034 PURPOSE.

- (A) The floodplain management regulations are established to promote public health, safety, and general welfare, and to minimize losses caused by the occupancy of floodplain areas by uses vulnerable to floods or that are not designed to minimize flood damage.
- (B) This ordinance is established to maintain eligibility in the National Flood Insurance Program.
- (C) Permitted uses in the Floodplain Management Overlay District shall be those uses of land or structures listed as permitted uses in the underlying zoning use district, as listed elsewhere in this chapter.

§ 154.035 WARNING AND DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY.

This ordinance does not imply that areas outside the floodplain districts or land uses permitted within such districts will be free from flooding or flood damages. Not all flood risk is mapped. Larger floods do occur, and the flood height may be increased by man-made or natural causes, such as ice jams or bridge openings restricted by debris. This ordinance does not create liability on the part of the City of Waseca or its officers or employees for any flood damages that result from reliance on this ordinance, or any administrative decision lawfully made hereunder.

§ 154.036 JURISDICTION AND DISTRICTS.

(A) The following maps, together with all attached material, are hereby adopted by reference and declared to be a part of the official zoning map and this ordinance. The attached material includes the Flood Insurance Study for Waseca County, Minnesota and Incorporated Areas, and the Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) panels enumerated below, all dated March 27, 2024, and prepared by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). These materials are filed in the Engineering Department at City Hall.

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- (B) This ordinance applies to all lands under the jurisdiction of the City of Waseca within the Floodplain, shown as Zone A on the Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM) panels referenced in Section 154.036 (A).
- (C) The standards imposed in this overlay district are in addition to any other requirements. In case of a conflict, the more restrictive standards will apply.
- (D) Where a conflict exists between the floodplain limits illustrated on the official floodplain maps and actual field conditions, the Base Flood Elevation (BFE) shall be the governing factor in locating the outer boundaries of the one percent (1%) annual chance floodplain.
- (E) Persons contesting the location of the district boundaries will be given a reasonable opportunity to present their case to the City and to submit technical evidence.

§ 154.037 MINIMUM DEVELOPMENT STANDARDS.

- (A) Buildings and Structures.
 - No new structures, such as buildings or accessory structures, may be permitted in the regulatory floodplain. Modifications and alterations of nonconforming structures are subject to Section § 154.039.
- (B) Fences.

Fences not meeting the definition of farm fences are not permitted.

- (C) Transportation Facilities.
 - (1) Railroad tracks, roads, and bridges must be elevated to the Regulatory Flood Protection Elevation (RFPE) where such facilities are essential to the orderly functioning of the area, or where failure or interruption would result in danger to public health or safety.
 - (2) Minor or auxiliary roads or railroads may be constructed at a lower elevation where failure or interruption of transportation services would not endanger public health or safety.
 - (3) All public transportation facilities should be designed to minimize increases in flood elevations.
- (D) Land Alterations.

In areas within twenty-five (25) feet of the Ordinary High-Water Level (OHWL), land alterations shall be restricted to:

- (1) The minimum required to accommodate beach and access areas, not to exceed a volume greater than ten (10) cubic yards; and
- (2) The minimum required to accommodate for public utilities, roads, railroad tracks, bridges, and shoreline stabilization projects to correct an identified erosion problem, as verified by a qualified resource agency, the Director of Engineering, or designee.
- (E) Recreational vehicles within the floodplain must be travel ready, meeting the following criteria:
 - (1) The vehicle must be fully licensed.
 - (2) The vehicle must be ready for highway use, meaning on wheels or internal jacking system and attached to the site only by quick disconnect type utilities.
 - (3) No permanent structural type additions may be attached to the vehicle.
- (F) Water, Sewage, and Disposal Requirements.

The Zoning Administrator or designee shall require within floodplain areas:

- (1) All utilities such as gas, electrical, sewer, and water supply systems must be elevated and/or floodproofed to the Regulatory Flood Protection Elevation (RFPE), be located and constructed to minimize or eliminate flood damage and be designed to eliminate infiltration of flood waters into the systems and discharges from the systems into flood waters. All public utilities should be designed to minimize increases in flood elevations. New solid waste management facilities, as defined in Minnesota Rules, part 7035.0300, are prohibited. Water supply systems are subject to the provisions of Minnesota Rules, part 4725.4350.
- (2) Private On-Site Water Supply, Individual Sewage Treatment Systems, and other Service Facilities shall be subject to applicable provisions detailed in Section 154.037 (F) (1). Replacement of on-site sewage treatment systems are to be constructed to avoid impairment to them, or contamination from them, during times of flooding, shall not be located in a designated floodway, and are subject to the provisions of Minnesota Rules, part 7080.2270. No new private service facilities may be permitted in the regulatory floodplain.
- (3) Materials that, in time of flooding, are buoyant, flammable, explosive, or could be injurious to human, animal, or plant life, as well as those likely to cause pollution of the waters, such as sewage, sand, rock, wrecked and discarded equipment, dredged spoil, municipal, agricultural, or industrial waste, and other wastes as further defined in Minnesota Statutes, Section 115.01, are prohibited.

§ 154.038 ENCROACHMENT ANALYSIS.

Development in the following areas requires hydrologic and hydraulic analysis performed by a professional engineer or the use of other standard engineering practices (e.g. projects that restore the site to the previous cross-sectional area).

- (A) In a floodway, development may not result in any of the following during the one percent (1%) annual chance flood: cause a stage increase of 0.00 feet or greater, obstruct flood flows, or increase velocities.
- (B) In areas where a floodway has not been delineated, development may not allow stage increases of more than one-half (0.5) foot at any point during the one percent (1%) chance flood. This evaluation must include the cumulative effects of previous encroachments. A water surface elevation increase of less than one-half (0.5) foot is required if, due to the water surface level increase, increased flood damages would potentially result.

§ 154.039 NONCONFORMITIES.

- (A) Continuance of Nonconformities: A use, structure, or occupancy of land which was lawful before the passage or amendment of this ordinance, but which is not in conformity with the provisions of this ordinance, may be continued subject to the following conditions:
 - 1. Within the floodway, or where the floodway has not been delineated, any expansion or enlargement of uses or structures is prohibited.
 - 2. Any addition, modification, rehabilitation, repair, or alteration shall be in conformance with the provisions of this ordinance, shall not increase the flood damage potential or increase the degree of obstruction to flood flows, and where applicable, must be protected to the Regulatory Flood Protection Elevation (RFPE).
 - 3. If any nonconforming structure is determined to be substantially damaged or substantially improved in accordance with Section § 154.040, it may not be reconstructed except in conformity with the provisions of this ordinance.
 - 4. If any nonconforming use, or any use of a nonconforming structure, is discontinued for more than one (1) year, any future use of the premises must conform to this ordinance.
- (B) Standards for Modifications and Alterations of Nonconforming Structures: In addition to the standards identified in Section § 154.037, the following standards and procedures apply to additions, modifications, rehabilitations, repairs, alterations, or maintenance of nonconforming structures:
 - 1. All structures, including manufactured homes, must be elevated on fill so that the lowest floor of the lowest enclosed area (including basements) is at, or above, the Regulatory Flood Protection Elevation (RFPE). The finished fill elevation shall be at, or above, the elevation associated with the base flood plus any stage increases that result from designation of a floodway. Fill must extend at the same elevation at least fifteen (15) feet beyond the outside limits of the structure. Elevations must be certified by a registered professional engineer, land surveyor, or other qualified person designated by the Zoning Administrator or Director of Engineering.

§ 154.040 SUBSTANTIAL IMPROVEMENT AND SUBSTANTIAL DAMAGES DETERMINATIONS.

Prior to issuing any permits for additions, modifications, rehabilitations, repairs, alterations, or maintenance to nonconforming structures, the Zoning Administrator or designee is required to determine if such work constitutes substantial improvement or repair of a substantially damaged structure. A determination must be made in accordance with the following procedures:

- (A) Estimate the market value of the structure. In the case of repairs, the market value of the structure shall be the market value before the damage occurred and before any restoration or repairs are made.
- (B) Estimate the cost of the project. The property owner shall accommodate for inspection, and furnish other documentation needed by the Zoning Administrator or designee, to evaluate costs.

- 1. Improvement costs shall be comprised of the market rate of all materials and labor, as well as the costs of all ordinary maintenance and upkeep carried out over the past one (1) year.
- Costs to repair damages shall be comprised of the market rate of all materials and labor required to restore a building to its pre-damaged condition regardless of the work proposed, as well as associated improvement costs if the structure is being restored beyond its predamaged condition.
- (C) Compare the cost of the improvement, repairs, or combination thereof to the estimated market value of the structure and determine whether the proposed work constitutes substantial improvement or repair of a substantially damaged structure, as defined in Section § 154.202.
- (D) Based on this determination, the Zoning Administrator or designee shall prepare a determination letter and notify the property owner accordingly. Structures determined to be substantially damaged or substantially improved may not be reconstructed except in conformity with the provisions of this ordinance.

§ 154.041 PERMITTING.

- (A) Permit Requirements.
 - 1. No person shall erect, construct, enlarge, alter, repair, improve, move, or demolish any building or structure without first obtaining a separate permit for each building or structure from the Building Official or designee.
 - No man-made change to improved or unimproved real estate, including but not limited to buildings or other structures, fences, mining, dredging, filling, grading, paving, excavation or drilling operations, shall be commenced until a separate permit has been obtained from the Building Official or designee for each change.
 - 3. No manufactured home shall be placed on improved or unimproved real estate without first obtaining a separate permit for each mobile home from the Building Official or designee.
- (B) Activities Not Requiring a Permit.
 - Certain uses or activities may be exempt from obtaining a permit, such as planting a garden, farming, or other obviously insignificant activities such as putting up a mailbox or flagpole. Farm fences, as defined in Section § 154.202 of this ordinance, are not considered to be an obstruction, and as such, do not require a permit. A local permit is not required if a Public Waters Work Permit has been obtained from the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (MnDNR), unless a significant area above the Ordinary High-Water Level (OHWL) is also to be disturbed. The continuation of existing uses, when the associated activities do not encroach further on the regulatory floodplain or trigger associated standards in this ordinance, do not require a permit.
- (C) Permit Application.
 - To obtain a permit, the applicant shall first file a permit application on a form provided by the City. The form must be completed and submitted to the Building Official or designee with a fee as established by the City Council before the issuance of a permit shall be considered. The permit application must include the following, as applicable:
 - 1. A site plan showing all existing or proposed buildings, structures, service facilities, potential obstructions, and pertinent design features having an influence on the permit.
 - 2. Locations and details of grading, fill, or storage of materials.
 - 3. Copies of any required local, state, or federal permits or approvals.
 - 4. Other relevant information requested by the Building Official or designee as necessary to properly evaluate the permit application. If the applicant deems the request for additional information to be excessive, the applicant may appeal to the Planning Commission.

§ 154.042 DUTIES OF THE ZONING ADMINISTRATOR AND BUILDING OFFICAL.

- (A) The Zoning Administrator or designee must maintain applicable records in perpetuity documenting the following:
 - 1. Encroachment analysis, as detailed in Section § 154.038.
 - 2. Final elevations, as applicable, detailing the elevations to which structures and improvements to structures are constructed or floodproofed. Elevations shall be determined by an engineer, architect, surveyor, or other qualified individual as approved by the Zoning Administrator, Director of Engineering, or designee.
 - 3. Substantial damage and substantial improvement determinations, as detailed in Section § 154.040, including the cost of improvements, repairs, and market value.
 - 4. All variance actions and justifications for their issuance. Variances must be reported as requested by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

(B) Permit Review.

The Building Official or designee shall review all permit applications to determine whether proposed building sites will be reasonably safe from flooding. If a proposed building site is in a floodplain area, all new construction and substantial improvements (including the placement of manufactured homes) shall be:

- Designed (or modified) and adequately anchored to prevent floatation, collapse, or lateral movement of the structure resulting from hydrodynamic and hydrostatic loads, including the effects of buoyancy;
- 2. Constructed with materials and utility equipment resistant to flood damage;
- 3. Constructed by methods and practices that minimize flood damage;
- 4. Constructed with electrical, heating, ventilation, plumbing, and air conditioning equipment and other service facilities that are designed and/or located so as to prevent water from entering or accumulating within the components during conditions of flooding;
- 5. Be reasonably safe from flooding and consistent with the need to minimize flood damage;
- 6. Be assured to provide adequate drainage to reduce exposure to flood hazards;
- 7. Not be detrimental to uses in adjoining areas; and
- 8. Not adversely affect the efficiency or restrict the flood carrying capacity of the channel and adjoining floodplain of any tributary watercourse or drainage system.

(C) Notifications Required.

- Notifications for Watercourse Alterations: Before authorizing any alteration or relocation of a
 river or stream, the Zoning Administrator or designee must notify adjacent communities. If the
 applicant has applied for a Public Waters Work Permit pursuant to Minnesota Statute, Section
 103G.245, this will suffice as adequate notice. A copy of the notification must also be
 submitted to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).
- 2. Notification to FEMA when Physical Changes Increase or Decrease Base Flood Elevations: Where physical changes affecting flooding conditions may increase or decrease the water surface elevation of the base flood, the City of Waseca must notify FEMA of the changes in order to obtain a Letter of Map Revision (LOMR) by submitting a copy of the relevant technical or scientific data as soon as practicable, but no later than six (6) months after the date such supporting information becomes available. Within areas where the floodway has not been delineated, a map revision is only required if development results in stage increases greater than one-half (0.5) feet.

§ 154.043 ADMINISTRATION.

(A) Subdivisions.

The Zoning Administrator or designee shall review subdivision proposals and other proposed new development to determine whether such proposals will be reasonably safe from flooding. If a subdivision proposal or other proposed new development is in a floodplain area, any such proposal shall be reviewed to assure that:

- All such proposals are consistent with the need to minimize flood damage within the floodplain area;
- 2. All public utilities and facilities, such as sewer, gas, electrical, and water systems are located and constructed to minimize or eliminate flood damage;
- 3. Adequate drainage is provided to reduce exposure to flood hazards;
- 4. All new lots must be able to accommodate a building site with a natural grade outside of the floodplain; and
- 5. All subdivisions must have vehicular access both to the subdivision and to the individual building sites no lower than two (2) feet below the Regulatory Flood Protection Elevation (RFPE).

(B) Variances.

The Zoning Administrator or designee shall review variance proposals and other proposed new development to determine whether such proposals will be reasonably safe from flooding. If a subdivision proposal or other proposed new development is in a floodplain area, any such proposal shall be reviewed to assure that:

- 1. An application for a variance to the provisions of this ordinance will be processed and reviewed in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, section 462.357, Subd. 6(2) and this ordinance.
- 2. Variances must not be issued within any designated regulatory floodway if any increase in flood levels during the base flood discharge would result.
- 3. Variances from the provisions in this ordinance may only be issued upon a determination that the variance is the minimum necessary, considering the flood hazard, to afford relief.
- 4. Variances must be consistent with the general purpose of these standards and the intent of applicable provisions in state and federal law.
- 5. Though variances may be used to modify permissible methods of flood protection, no variance shall permit a lesser degree of flood protection than the Regulatory Flood Protection Elevation (RFPE).
- The Zoning Administrator or designee must notify the applicant for a variance that:
 - (a) The issuance of a variance to construct a structure below the base flood level will result in increased premium rates for flood insurance; and
 - (b) Such construction below the base or regional flood level increases risks to life and property. Such notification must be maintained with a record of all variance actions.
- 7. Notifications to the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (MnDNR):
 - (a) All notices of public hearings to consider variances or conditional uses under this ordinance must be sent via electronic mail to the respective MnDNR area hydrologist at least ten (10) days before the hearings. Notices of hearings to consider subdivisions/plats must include copies of the subdivision/plat.
 - (b) A copy of all decisions granting variances or conditional uses under this ordinance must be sent via electronic mail to the respective MnDNR area hydrologist within ten (10) days of final action.

(C) Annexation and Extraterritorial Jurisdiction.

The City of Waseca shall not approve any development located in a Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) outside the corporate limits unless such development or plat is in accordance with the following:

- 1. A floodplain ordinance legally adopted by the City of Waseca that meets the minimum federal (44 CFR 60.3), state (Minnesota Regulation Parts 6120.5000 through 6120.6200), and local requirements for development within a special flood hazard area.
- 2. The SFHAs of those parts of unincorporated Waseca County that are within the extraterritorial jurisdiction of the City of Waseca or that may be annexed into the City of Waseca are generally identified as such on the Flood Insurance Rate Map (FIRM).
- 3. Annexations into panels not referenced in Section § 154.043 (C) require ordinance amendment in accordance with Section § 154.043 (D).

(D) Ordinance Amendments.

- 1. Any revisions to the floodplain maps by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) or annexations of new map panels require an ordinance amendment to update the map references in Section § 154.036 of this ordinance.
- 2. All amendments to this ordinance must be submitted to the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (MnDNR) for review and approval prior to adoption, and for compliance with state and federal rules and requirements. The floodplain ordinance shall not be considered valid until approved.

§ 154.044 PENALTY.

- (A) Uses in Violation of the Ordinance.
 - Every structure, fill, deposit, or other use placed or maintained in the floodplain in violation of this ordinance shall be considered a public nuisance.
- (B) Civil Remedies.
 - A public nuisance may be charged and abated under this ordinance by an action brought by the City of Waseca or the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (MnDNR).
- (C) Enforcement.
 - Violations of the provisions of this ordinance constitute a misdemeanor and are punishable as defined by law. The Zoning Administrator or designee may utilize the full array of enforcement actions available to it including, but not limited to, prosecution and fines, injunctions, after-the-fact permits, orders for corrective measures or a request to the National Flood Insurance Program for denial of flood insurance. The City of Waseca must act in good faith to enforce these official controls and to correct ordinance violations to the extent possible so as not to jeopardize its eligibility in the National Flood Insurance Program.
- (D) Any person who violates this subchapter shall upon conviction thereof be fined not less than \$25 nor more than \$200. A separate offense shall be deemed committed upon each day during, or on which, a violation occurs or continues.

§ 154.045 ABROGATION AND GREATER RESTRICTION.

- (A) This subchapter is not intended to repeal, abrogate, or impair any existing easements, covenants, or deed restrictions.
- (B) Where this subchapter and other ordinances, easements, covenants, or deed restrictions conflict or overlap, whichever imposes the more stringent restrictions shall prevail.

§ 154.046 SEPARABILITY.

The provisions and sections of this subchapter shall be deemed separable and the invalidity of any portion of this subchapter shall not affect the validity of the remainder.

SECTION 3. This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force 10 days after its passage.

BACKGROUND

New FEMA floodplain maps have been issued and will become effective March 27, 2024. Therefore, the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (MnDNR) has notified City staff that the City's floodplain ordinance must be revised prior to that date in order to comply with the new maps and state/federal requirements.

At their meeting on December 12, 2023, the Planning Commission conducted an initial review of floodplain ordinance revisions prepared by WSB and based on a model ordinance provided by the MnDNR. The Commission's comments were then incorporated into the ordinance revisions and sent to MnDNR staff for their review. City staff received the MnDNR comments on January 4, 2024, and have updated the ordinance revisions accordingly. Therefore, Ordinance No. 1113 is being presented to the Planning Commission for a vote of recommendation for adoption by City Council.

REQUESTED ACTIONS

Hold a public hearing on Ordinance No. 1113 and forward recommendations (by vote) for consideration by City Council at their meeting on February 20, 2024.

BACKGROUND: The City Council authorized the City Manager to sign an early access agreement with Waseca Real Estate Fund (WREF) February 2023, and the Council approved an additional six-month extension on September 5th, 2023, which is set to expire on February 21, 2024.

This means that WREF has had exclusive rights to research their development ideas for the past twelve months. Recently there was TIF application submitted with a proposal of a 36-unit apartment complex on the west half of Market Place. This extension would continue to allow the City and WREF to continue to work together while processing the TIF application and any other needed documents for development.

WREF would like to extend its exclusive access agreement for six months, from February 21, 2024, to September 21, 2024.

With WREF's agreement, the city is able to haul snow to the Market Place site through the winter. This clause was added to the agreement.

RECOMMENDATION: City Council authorizes the City Manager to extend the Early Access Agreement to September 21, 2024.

EARLY ACCESS AGREEMENT CITY OF WASECA

This Agreement is made and entered into this [16] day of [March], 2023, by and between [1868 Investments LLC], a [LLC in Minnesota] ("Developer"), and the City of Waseca ("Owner"); (collectively, the "parties").

WHEREAS, Owner is the owner of approximately [4.8] acres of real property described and depicted on Exhibit A attached hereto (the "Property");

WHEREAS, Developer has submitted a preliminary proposal to the City for development of the Property, and the City is willing to allow the Developer temporary access to the Property for the purposes of conducting investigations and studies into the feasibility of the proposed development of the Property; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to enter into this agreement for the purpose of allowing the Developer and City to continue to evaluate the feasibility and possibility of the Developer's proposed development being further pursued.

NOW, THEREFORE, for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt and sufficiency of which is hereby acknowledged, the parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. <u>Permission to Enter Property and Conduct Investigations</u>. Developer and its contractors and other agents shall have permission, at Developer's sole expense, to enter the Property to conduct surveys, environmental site assessments, soil investigations (including but not limited to soil borings), and other similar studies or investigations on the Property. Nothing herein shall permit Developer to perform any invasive or destructive investigatory work in any paved portions of any public rights-of-way adjoining the Property.
- 2. <u>Term of Access</u>. Developer and its contractors and other agents shall have permission to enter the Property and conduct investigations of the Property under this Agreement commencing on the date of this Agreement and for a period of [_180__] days thereafter (the "Term").
- 3. Hold Harmless and Indemnification. Developer shall indemnify, protect, save, hold harmless and insure Owner, and its respective officers, directors, employees and members and agents, from and against any and all claims and demands for, or litigation with respect to, all damages, including expenses, reasonable attorneys' fees, and costs of alternative dispute resolution, which may arise out of or be caused by Developer or its agents, employees, contractors, with respect to Developer's use of or presence on the Property. Developer shall defend Owner against the foregoing, or litigation in connection with the foregoing, at Developer's expense, with counsel reasonably acceptable to Owner. Owner, at its expense, shall have the right to participate in the defense of any claims or litigation and shall have the right to approve any settlement, which approval shall not be unreasonably withheld. The indemnification provision of this Section shall not apply to damages or other losses proximately caused by or resulting from the negligence or willful misconduct of Owner. All indemnification obligations

shall survive termination of this Agreement, provided that the incident giving rise to the indemnification obligation must have occurred during the term of this Agreement.

- 4. <u>Insurance.</u> At all times throughout the term of this Agreement, Developer shall maintain at a minimum the following insurance coverage from financially solvent insurance carriers approved by the City:
 - a. Statutory worker's compensation coverage;
 - b. Commercial General Liability Insurance \$2,000,000 combined single limit, written on an occurrence basis, insuring Developer against claims for bodily injury, death or property damage arising out of its general business activities (including automobile or vehicle use), and including endorsements to include contractual liability;
 - c. Any other insurance coverages required by state or federal laws or regulations applicable to Developer.

Developer must cause certificate(s) of insurance evidencing the required coverages to be provided to the City Clerk on or prior to the effective date. The issuer of the certificate of insurance must provide the City ten days' written notice, by certified mail, prior to cancellation, non-renewal, or material change in the insurance policy(ies).

All insurance required by this Agreement must be primary insurance and not in excess of or contributing with other insurance which Developer or its designee may carry. All policies, excluding worker's compensation policies, must name the City as an additional insured. The applicable insurance policies required by this Agreement, must apply separately to City as if separate policies had been issued to Developer and the City.

Waiver and Assumption of Risk. Developer knows, understands, and 5. acknowledges the risks and hazards associated with using the Property for the purposes permitted herein and hereby assumes any and all risks and hazards associated therewith. Developer hereby assumes liability, and agrees to be fully and exclusively responsible, for the safety of the persons and property of all of Developer's agents, representatives, participants, volunteers, guests and invitees while using the Property or the improvements thereon or performing maintenance thereon or otherwise present on the Property as a result of this Agreement. Developer hereby irrevocably waives any and all claims against the Owner or any of its officials, employees or agents for any bodily injury (including death), loss or property damage incurred by the Developer or any person present on the Property pursuant to this Agreement and hereby irrevocably releases and discharges the Owner and any of its officials, employees or agents from any and all such claims of liability related in any way to the Property or the Owner's maintenance, repair or other work conducted within the Property by the Developer or Owner or any other third party. The Owner shall have no liability to the Developer or Developer's agents, representatives, participants, volunteers, guests and invitees for personal injury or damage to property, including motor vehicles, occurring at or about the Property during any hours of use by the Developer.

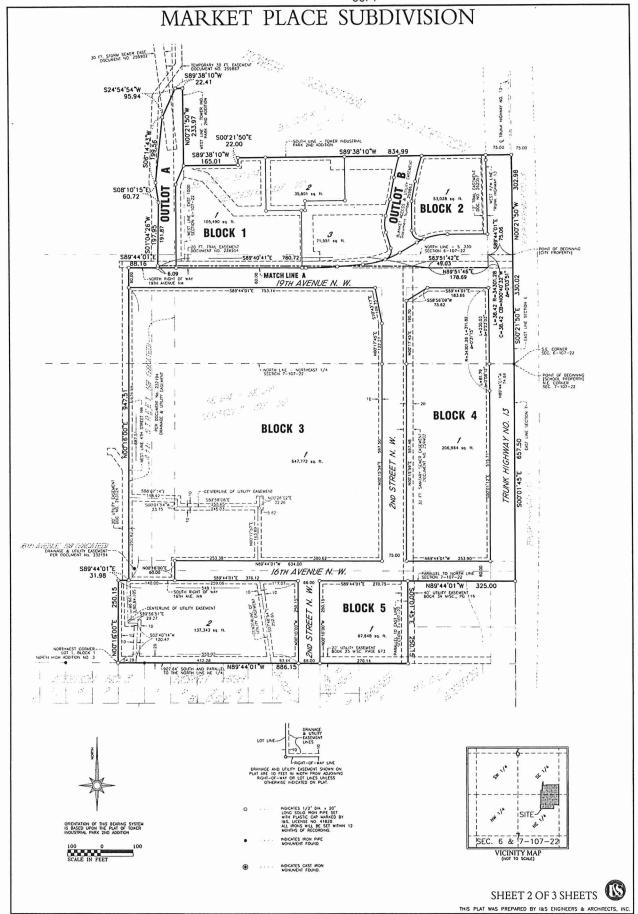
- 6. <u>Restoration of Property</u>. Developer agrees to restore, or have its contractors and other agents restore, any land affected by any borings on the Property and after Developer's investigation of the Property is complete. Developer and Owner agree that Developer's obligation to restore the Property shall be limited to returning the land affected to the grade existing before the investigations and borings were conducted.
- 7. <u>Non-Exclusive</u>. The permissions granted the Developer under this Agreement, including but not limited to the permission to access the Property, are non-exclusive in nature.
- 8. <u>Miscellaneous</u>. This Agreement shall be deemed to have been made in the County of Waseca, Minnesota and governed by the laws of the State of Minnesota. This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns. This Agreement may be executed in two or more counterparts, all of which, taken together, shall be deemed to be one and the same document. Facsimile and e-mailed signatures shall be deemed to be originals; provided, however, that upon request of any party an original signed counterpart shall be transmitted to the requesting party by return mail.

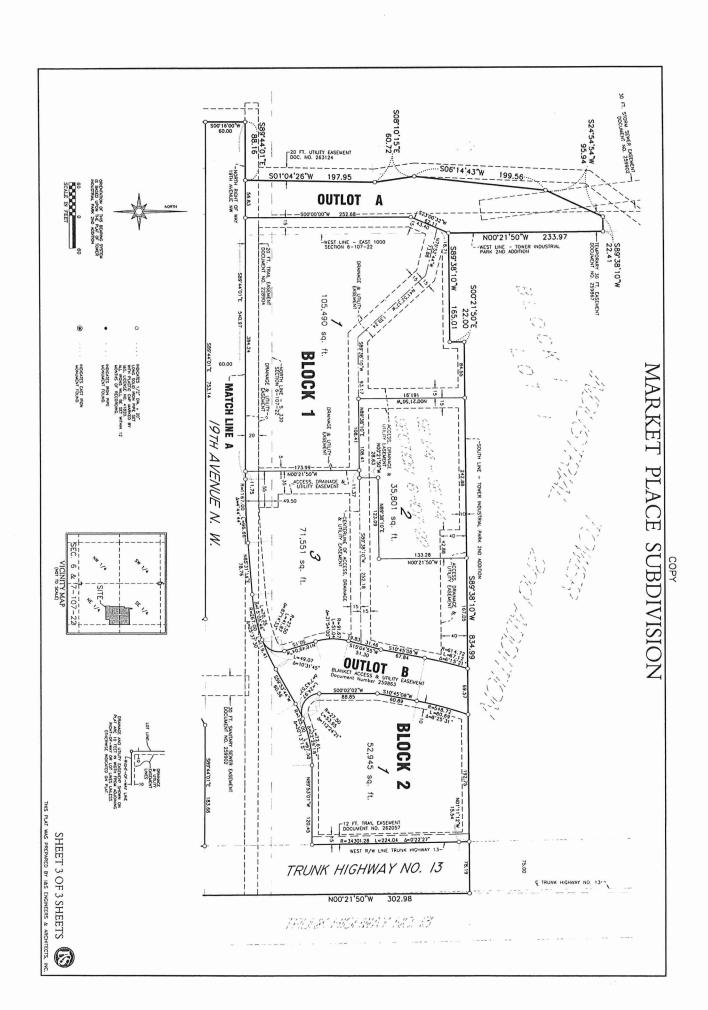
